



Delicate Apple

Supplies:

- 1 All normal embroidery supplies
- 1 Opal colored Mylar, 8" x 9" if you do both apple design and word.
- 1 Thread colors from the included thread chart

Instructions:

Placement line, thread color #1, is shown in bright blue. The placement line shows where to place the applique material. Bright blue is not the thread color that will be used for the placement stitching. Bright blue is used to stop the machine so you can perform a task. Use the thread color #3 for the placement stitching.

Tack down line, thread color #2, is shown in bright red. The tack down line holds the Mylar. Red is not the thread color that will be used for the tack down stitching. Red is used to stop the machine so you can perform a task. Use the thread color #3 for the tack down stitching.

1. Stitch thread color #1. This is the placement line for the Mylar.
2. Place a piece of Mylar large enough to cover the stitches.
3. Stitch thread color #2. This is the tack down line.
4. Stitch thread color #3. This is an overlay over the Mylar so it does not perforate and fall out.
5. Tearaway the excess Mylar.
6. Stitch remaining thread colors.
